

Here are some guidelines for dealing with violations. Serious violations should be recorded on a Violation Report. This red form is available in the club house.

1. Be polite and respectful.
2. Get pertinent information. Who, what where and when. It is far easier to work on a problem when we have the above information. If you are unwilling to make personal contact, take pictures or record specific information. Often a conversation is sufficient to solve minor problems
3. Contact the Chief Range Officer or a member of the executive board in a timely manner.
4. Know the rules yourself and follow them.

Some serious violations can result in the loss of club membership but we would prefer members follow the common sense safety rules.

Center Fire Bench Rest

Center Fire Bench Rest Matches will be conducted on the following dates and are open to all BRC members. There is NO fee to participate. Matches are held from 9:30 AM - 12:00 noon. Matches will be conducted on: July 17, 2021, Aug 7, 2021, Aug 21, 2021, Aug 28, 2021.

Standard Operating Rules For 500 Meter Range

1. Red Badge Certified Members Only. Red Badge must be worn.
2. All Shooters must sign in prior to shooting. (A sign-in sheet will be in the shed next to the guest sign-in sheet. Sign in with date, name, time in/out.)
3. All shooting to be done from the bench top only. (No prone or standing are allowed.)
4. No hand guns allowed. Only rifles or bolt-action pistols.
5. Every time prior to using 200/300/500m range, rifle and ammunition must be sighted in at 100 yards. a 5 shot 3 inch group must be held to move to 200/300/500m distances.
6. Minimum muzzle velocity must exceed 2300 ft per second. If in doubt do not shoot until you can get chronographed.
7. Only BRC provided steel targets allowed.
8. When 'cease fire' is called, properly display Hot/Cold sign with warning light.
- "Cold" means it is safe to go down range. Warning lights to be on when range is cold.
- "Hot means the range is active. Do not go forward of the firing line.
9. No handling of firearms when range is Cold.
10. All firearms must be racked or cased & off the firing line with bolts open or chamber indicated and magazines removed when range is Cold.
11. Bench rest, BR-50, CMP and Highpower disciplines have control of the entire firing line during their matches. All lanes will be closed to non-participants at that time.
12. Check website for the times when the

disciplines have matches scheduled.

500 Meter Range

The 500 Meter Range consists of 18 shooting benches, the first 12 are for general use by all members and their guests. The benches are numbered 1 thru 18 from left to right.

BENCHES 13 THRU 18 ARE POSITIONED FOR USE OUT TO 500 METERS AND ARE ONLY TO BE USED BY THOSE BRC MEMBERS WHO HAVE GONE THROUGH THE QUALIFICATION PROCESS FOR THAT RANGE. NO GUEST IS ALLOWED TO USE THIS PORTION OF THE RANGE.

The qualification process is posted in the club house and on the bulletin board at the 500 meter range. That process is:

1. Shoot a 3 shot group a 100 yards to verify rifle zero.
2. Obtain bullet weight and velocity.
3. Calculate the necessary sight change to impact at 500 meters (547 yards).
4. Prove proper sight adjustment from calculations in step "3" by shooting another 3 shot group at 100 yards with the calculated adjustments made to your sights. The group should be 9 inches to 17 inches high depending on bullet speed and weight.
5. After the rifle is properly adjusted to strike high at 100 yards, the shooter to be qualified must fire 4 shots at 500 meters; all shots must strike within a 20 inch square steel plate. More than 4 shots are

allowed as needed.

6. Upon completion of the above orientation, the member's name and \$5.00 processing fee, will be forwarded to Jon Nortemann. A special "RED 500 Meter" badge, with the members name will be made for the member to wear. The member will also have his/her membership card signed to substitute for the badge until it arrives.

THE 500 METER RANGE IS FOR QUALIFIED BRC MEMBERS ONLY! NO GUESTS! We have over 290 members qualified. Before members may use the shorter range target boards, 200 meters, 300 meters and steel targets, they MUST BE QUALIFIED AT 500 METERS. Guests are not allowed to use the shorter ranges on the 500 Meter Range at any time or the 500 meter target boards and steel targets. NOTE: ONLY QUALIFIED BRC MEMBERS ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE 500 METER RANGE, BENCH POSITIONS 13 THRU 18 REGARDLESS OF THE RANGES AT WHICH BACKSTOPS AND TARGET BOARDS ARE INSTALLED.

I will be qualifying members to use the 500 meter range on any Wednesday morning that the 'Wednesday Morning Group' shoots, between 9:00 AM and noon. I will also qualify members on the Saturdays that Center Fire Bench Rest Matches are scheduled. You may call the other 9 members to set up other times if needed. If you are shooting a caliber that is damaging our steel targets and/or range facilities, PLEASE STOP. This club belongs to each BRC member and needs to be treated with respect. Normal wear and tear is expected but should not be accelerated. Thank-you.

Remember: These Are Rules

1. No unintended discharge of a firearm.
2. No rounds to leave the range.
3. Wear your safety glasses and hearing protection

4. ALL members, whether new this year or a 40 year plus veteran have a duty to see that our rules and procedures are followed. Politely remind each other if infractions are observed. We have a 'jewel' of a club. Please keep it that way. THANK YOU!

5. No 50 BMG's to be used on Club grounds at any time!

6. Always wear your Membership Badge.

Wisconsin Sergeant York Report

The WI Sergeant York Shoot was held Saturday, June 26, 2021 on the Black Powder Lodge Range. It was a rainy day. The rain stopped about mid day and we then had high humidity for the rest of the shoot.

We had eleven register to shoot, plus some spectators to watch what was going on. We had a couple of new faces join us, one moved to Wisconsin from Ohio and had shot in Chunk Gun matches before. The other new face shot on our range years ago, but this was his first Chunk Gun Match. Everyone seemed to have a good time, but was glad to get the shoot over, and get somewhere where it was cool! The shooters shot for various prizes, from framed certificates to gold dollars, powder, round balls, cheese and bottled syrup. The 1st place winner received an antique collector plate, made in England 47 years ago. The value unknown!

In a Wisconsin sanctioned Chunk Gun match five places are paid out, plus the Sweetest Shot or the Best Shot of the sheet. The Sweetest Shot winner received a bottle of pure Maple syrup from Gosda's Back Forty Sappers in Comstock, WI and was won by Dan Bredberg from Carbon Cliff, Illinois, with a score of .040 thousand's of an inch from the center of the X on the target.

The 2021 winter indoor .22 rifle and pistol Silhouette target shooting season ended on Monday April 26th. We had good participation again this year. Brendon Leach had the most improved average with a rifle, increasing his score by 1.436 points over the season. Brendon was also most improved with the pistol, with a 2.641 point increase. Dennis Loertscher hit five in a row five times with his light rifle and three times with his heavy rifle. Brendon hit 5 in a row once with his pistol. Thank you and congratulations to everyone that participated this season. I would like to thank Dennis Loertscher for opening and closing the range, being our statistician, and keeping track of scores and averages again this year.

The 2021 weekly outdoor Silhouette target shooting season started on Thursday, May 6th and continues until Thursday, September 30th. We shoot a 40 round match every Thursday night, starting at around 5:15ish. We are usually done shooting rifles by 6:30. Everyone is encouraged to participate. We generally have 6 to 10 shooters each week. Bring your .22 rifle with Standard or High Velocity ammunition. You don't have to be a great shot. Come out and have some fun. You are all welcome to join us!

Our first 80 round monthly match for 2021 was held on Saturday, May 22nd. It was a beautiful sunny day. There were 10 competitors. Craig Stevens was the match winner in Standard (Heavy) Class hitting 45 out of 80. Craig was also the match winner in Hunter (Light) Class hitting 54 out of 80.

Our second 80 round monthly match was held on Saturday, June 26th. The weather was windy and raining. This match had only 5 competitors. Craig Stevens was the big winner again this weekend. Craig was the match winner in Standard (Heavy) Class hitting 54 out of 80. He was also the match winner in Hunter (Light) Class hitting 48 out of 80. Congratulations Craig, you are having a great season!

Future monthly Saturday matches are scheduled for July 24, Aug 21 [State Championship], and Sept 18. Again, you are encouraged to come out and join in the fun. From the BRC Historian “Back The Badge”

When I see those signs in people's yards, Back the Badge, I think of my son, Christopher, who is a Lieutenant on the Sheriff Department in Henery County, Georgia. I recently sent him a plaque that hangs on his wall that states, “Not all men are created equal, only the finest become policemen.” I know he backs the badge! And I am very proud of him for what he does.



When I joined the Beloit Rifle Club in 1977, the membership was closed at 150. You then were put on a waiting list and when and if someone left the club you could join. The club was building the indoor range at the time and they would hold work days Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m. I actually started at the club in 1976 at these work days but I had to wait until 1977 to come into the club. Bill Wentland was President of the club and I had to go to his house to be interviewed. Cliff Grimm sponsored me and you only needed one at that time. You also did not need work hours to renew your dues.

So in 1977 when I became a member I received my 1st badge and thus I started to back the badge. I didn't know or think of it at the time, but that's what I was doing, backing that badge.

When you wear a badge, no matter what kind, for what reason, you should be prepared to back that badge. When you wear a club's badge be proud of that club. It's badge is a reflection of what kind of person you are, and a statement you are trying to make or have made.

At the Beloit Rifle Club's first gun show in the early 1980's I bought a box from one of the members selling things and in the box was several Beloit Rifle Club Badges. The years ranging 1957 thru 1966. The 1957 badge is quite different from the rest. The 1958 thru 1960 are larger than the 1957 badge. But then the 1961 thru 1964 are smaller. The 1965 badge was missing. Then in 1966 we go back to the bigger badge. If you notice the members name is on it such as the badges issued now. My badge issued in 1977 is similar to the one issued in 1966, but if you notice mine contains NRA affiliated. I do not know when the club became a 100% NRA club.

Also, my badge does not have the year it was issued. But the year you joined is stated on your membership card. Mine is anyway, I know Jon Nortemann keeps that in his records.

Maybe years ago when you renewed your dues you received a new badge each year? Good?

I talked to Jon Nortemann, the membership chairperson, thinking he made the badges for he new members, but he said he doesn't. Jon said he joined the club in 1973 and he couldn't remember the members' name who was making them then. Rick Babcock started making the badges about 3 years ago, prior to then Tom Jenkins made badges. Hats off to Rick Babcock, because we have over eleven hundred members and more coming in each year. We also issue a badge for about everything that goes on at the club. Let me list a few that I know of.

The GREEN badge is for beginning or probationary members. A two year badge! Prior to a white one. The WHITE badge is for regular members. The ORANGE badge is for board members. The RED badge is for the member who qualified on the 500 meters range. The BLUE badge is for the cowboy action and black powder pistol certification. You need this in order to practice on any range with a black powder revolver. Check the club's rule book. The PINK badges are for guests and must be returned when the guest leaves. The YELLOW or GOLD badges are for life members. Those badges are issued to members who have met certain obligations and who have gone above and beyond what is expected from a regular member. But: No matter what badge or what color of badge you choose to wear, wear it with pride, and be prepared to **BACK THAT BADGE!**

No applicant may sponsor a new member until full membership status is attained. New Beloit Rifle Club members must attend and complete "one" of "three" orientation sessions offered during the first year of their membership or renewal of membership will not be possible.

Service Hours for Dues Reduction: During the first year of your probationary membership, if you choose to volunteer sixteen (16) hours of service to the club, your dues for the following year will be reduced. These 16 volunteer hours, are only for the first year of your probationary membership. If you choose not to volunteer to help out at the club, the cost for renewal will be appropriately higher.

I have read the Beloit Rifle Club rules and agree to obey them. My sponsors and I have reviewed the club facilities and I understand the operating procedure on each range. I have not been convicted of a felony in Wisconsin or in any other of the 49 States and I realize that a public records background check will be conducted.



WHEREAS, in consideration of my child (both parent/guardian and child may hereinafter be referred to as the "participant") being allowed to participate in the Brownells/NRA Day Program Youth Sports Fest, involving instruction and coaching in firearms handling and the shooting sports, on the ranges and facilities of the Beloit Rifle Club and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledge, I, the child's Parent/Guardian, for myself and for and on behalf of the Minor, acknowledge and agree to the following:

Parent/Guardian hereby certifies that the above named youth is of the proper age and maturity to learn about firearm safety, the history of our American Heritage and the role firearms played in it, and to handle firearms in learning the fundamentals of shooting sports.

Parent/Guardian (on behalf of himself and the child) furthermore waives for themselves and their executors, administrators, assignees or heirs, any and all rights and claims for injuries, illnesses, damages or losses to participant, and any other actions or demands whatsoever, which participant, individually or jointly and severally, may have or which may arise against the Beloit Rifle Club, Rock County Rifle and Pistol Club, Beloit Field Archers, Beloit Izaak Walton Conservation Club, Pine Tree Pistol Club, National Rifle Association (NRA), any Sponsors, and staff and volunteers of the Brownells/NRA Day Program Youth Sports Fest.

Parent/Guardian and the child understand that firearms and their ammunition may be hazardous and that they (even a picnic on the range premises) can cause injury or death in certain circumstances.
