MEMBERSHIP

This is a reminder regarding membership responsibilities for both dues paying members and prospective new members. Anyone sponsoring a prospective new member, must get the application to the membership committee before December 31, 2021. Applications turned in after that date will be for the "2022" membership group. All applications must be either mailed in or given to Jon Nortemann, or James Searing, at club functions. Do not attempt to deliver the applications to us at our homes.

A few reminders regarding current members. The small padlock key will also be used as the main gate key. We are changing the padlocks again this year. That will go into effect February 6, 2022. Your current padlock key will not work after February 6, 2022. If you do not have a current key to exchange, a new key will be \$5.00. I have included a payment schedule so that you can determine your cost for renewal.

PAYMENT OF DUES: Most of the payment of dues occurs at the Dues Collection Day, February 6, 2022. Remember also that dues collection will be at Boundaries Bar and Grill. Dues will be collected from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. It is important to remember that your range key, padlock key, will not work after February 6, 2022. If you cannot make the first collection, there will be alternate dates for you to renew, collection on those dates will be at the Beloit Rifle Club clubhouse. REMINDER: Your padlock key will need to be **taped securely,** when mailing in your BRC Membership card, NRA membership status and payment. Membership card and padlock key will be mailed to you. If above conditions are not met, your membership will not be processed.

This option should be exercised only as a last resort. We will make every effort to process the mail renewals as quickly as possible. REPEATING!!

All 2022 new membership applications must be turned in BEFORE December 31, 2021. They must be postmarked no later than December 31, 2021. Make sure they are filled out completely! Two valid signatures and a valid NRA number. If either of these items is missing, or determined to not be valid, the application will be returned! The new member will then have to wait until next year to begin the application process. Please be careful with these items. Criminal background checks will be made on all Wisconsin applicants. All Illinois applicants must show a current F.O.I.D. card when being processed for club membership in March.

REPEATING!!

The Board has decided that since current members have five (5) opportunities to pay their dues and have a mail in option to pay dues, any member not paying their dues by Wednesday in April 6, 2022, will be required to go through the new member application process, if they wish to continue their membership.



Program Guidelines:

- 1. All entrants shall be members in good standing of the Wisconsin Muzzle Loader Association. Do not have to be a member at time of kill, must become a member before apply in the award program.
- 2. All game must be harvested in MEMBERS HOME STATE during the established legal season and be taken using a muzzleloader approved by the Department of Natural Resources, following good sportsmanship and fair chase practices.
- 3. A plaque shall be awarded at the WMLA Annual Membership Meeting to the entrant who establishes a new record or exceeds a WMLA state record for each category.
- 4. In addition to the plaque, members who establish a new, or exceed a previously established record in either the deer or bear categories, shall have a donation of \$50.00 in his/her name made to a conservation oriented, non-profit organization operating in Wisconsin.
- 5. The top entrant in all categories, not establishing a new record or exceeding a previously established state record, shall be recognized at the WMLA Annual Members Meeting with a framed certificate.
- 6. All entrants shall receive WMLA Big Game Award pins.
- 7. Antlerless deer qualify for WMLA Big Game Award pins.

Scoring Procedure

- 1. Scoring for whitetail deer and bear shall follow the boone and Crockett Scoring System.
- 2. Scoring for wild turkey shall follow the National Wild Turkey Federation Scoring System. (Field dressed weight, plus two times the beard length, plus ten times the combiner length of both spurs.)
- 3. Scoring for Canada goose shall be body weight at time of harvest.

Entry Procedure

- 1. Entrants shall fill out and mail the entry from, available in the Badger State Muzzleloader, along with \$5.00 entry fee, or otherwise notify the Hunting Committee Chairperson of their intent to enter, within 60 days of the close of that particular season.
- 2. Upon receipt of the completed entry form and one picture of the big game entry and payment of \$5.00 entry fee, the committee shall: *Forward the applicant the procedures for scoring their entry, and a WMLA Big Game Award pin.


Program Guidelines:

- * A WMLA Predator Award pin will be given at the WMLA Annual Members Meeting.




How to Load a Muzzleloader








2. With the hammer down for safety, clean the frizzen, pan, and flint (watch out for the sharp edges on the flint). Be sure the flash hole is clear of obstruction by inserting a vent pick, paper clip, or pipe cleaner. Load a flintlock with the frizzen and hammer all the way forward.

clip. With an unloaded firearm snap a cap or two. Always point the muzzle in a safe direction.



4. Pour the measured powder charge down the bore. Avoid placing hands or face directly over the muzzle.





5. Center a lubricated or moistened patch over the bore and place the lead ball onto the patch.




6. With the short end of a short starter, set the patched ball into the bore. Use the palm of your hand.




7. Push the ball deeper with the long end of the short starter by using the palm of your hand.



8. Firmly seat the load against the powder charge by using short strokes with your ramrod. NEVER fire a muzzleloader if the ball is not firmly seated on the powder charge.



9. Use a pencil to make a reference mark on your ramrod when the lead ball is correctly loaded.



11. For a flintlock, fill the pan 1/4 to 1/3 full of priming powder, close frizzen, and place hammer into the half-cock position until ready to fire. When ready to shoot, bring the hammer into the full cock position.



For a percussion-type muzzleloader, place a cap firmly onto the nipple and bring the hammer into the half-cock position. When ready to shoot, place the hammer into full cock.



12. Be certain of your target and what lies beyond, aim, and fire.

Run a damp cleaning patch down the bore and begin the process again (except for step #9).

Shooting Sports and Lead Poisoning

When you think about the problem of lead poisoning you generally think of kids in old houses chewing on some paint chips. That's true, but for the person who is actively involved in the shooting sports, as we are here in the Beloit Rifle Club, the reality of lead poisoning is much more personal and meaningful. Thousands of people in the U.S. are affected by lead poisoning every year and people involved in recreational shooting activities are more at risk than the general public. Consider the amount you come in contact with when handling ammunition to load your firearms, or cartridge reloading or even the virtually invisible lead mist from bullets and primers when you actually fire your gun. Lead in your blood is an obvious problem (check the internet) but it can precipitate other issues such as heart and other organ problems. There are members in our club who have experienced this.

With more and more women now involved in shooting activities (heck, there are some women who are learning to like the fragrance of Hoppe's #9 almost as much as Chanel #5) the issue is even more critical since women tend to put their hands on their face more often than men and, of course, the possibility of the lead effects on pregnancy.

Enough of the scary stuff. What can we do about it? The solution is pretty easy and simple, especially since we all now have practice with the Covid protocol. WASH YOUR HANDS AND FACE after shooting or reloading. That's it. I suppose if you wish to be very cautious you could wear a mask for a prolonged shooting activity. The risk of lead poisoning is low, but real and reducing that risk is easily done. If you are really worried about this, your doctor can provide a blood test to determine lead levels in your system. Safe shooting.

Rimfire Benchrest

Q: What is ARA Benchrest?

The only rule for ARA is that the rifle is a 22LR. That means any make or model, any scope, any ammo. Any rest may be used to shoot from the bench. One piece rests separate front and rear rests, or sandbags may be used, so long as any such device prevents the barreled action from being affixed to the bench in an immovable manner.

Q: What sort of target is used in ARA?

The target has 25 bulls and is blue in color.

Q: How much time is allowed for each target?

You will have 20 minutes to complete each target. You mau shoot as many sighter targets as you wish, but record targets must be completed with the 20 minutes.

Q: What are the safety considerations?

After completing target of after 20 minute period all rifles must be racked in stands behind benches. Note: Wind flags may be used. Also barrel turners.

Q: What is Barnyard Benchrest?

Barnyard Benchrest is a 22 cal benchrest match.

Q: What type of equipment do you need in Barnyard Benchrest?

A North American made .22 rifle with the original stock, barrel and trigger. Any type of action is allowed. The rifle must retail or have a 1999 Blue Book (100% condition) for \$500 or less. Glass bedding, trigger job, and recrowning of barrel allowed. No barrel turners allowed. Rifles must weigh 7.5 lbs. or less with scope. Scopes must be 9X or less. You can use a variable scope providing it is set at 9X. Ammo must be North American made. No wind flags are allowed. Any type of sand bag style rests are allowed. A front bipod may be used, but will be considered as part of the total weight of the rifle.

Q: What sort of target is used in Barnyard Benchrest?

The targets for Barnyard Benchrest have 20 bulls rather than the 25 as in the other division. The bulls are slightly larger and are red in color.

Q: How much time is allowed for each target?

You will have 20 minutes to complete each target. You may shoot as many sighter targets as you wish, but recorded targets must be completed within 20 minutes.

Q: What are the safety considerations?

After completing targets or after 20 minutes all rifles must be racked in the stands behind the benches.

STANDARD OPERATING RULES FOR 500 METER RANGE

- 1. Red Badge Certified Members Only. Red Badge must be worn.
- 2. All Shooters must sign in prior to shooting. (A sign-in sheet will be in the shed next to the guest sign-in sheet. Sign in with date, name, time in/out.)
- 3. All shooting to be done from the bench top only. (No prone or standing are allowed.)
- 4. No hand guns allowed. Only rifles or bolt-action pistols.
- 5. Every time prior to using 200/300/500m range, rifle and ammunition must be sighted in at 100 yards. a 5 shot 3 inch group must be held to move to 200/300/500m distances.
- 6. Minimum muzzle velocity must exceed 2300 ft per second. If in doubt do not shoot until you can get chronographed.
- 7. Only BRC provided steel targets allowed.
- 8. When 'cease fire' is called, properly display Hot/Cold sign with warning light.
- -"Cold" means it is safe to go down range. Warning lights to be on when range is cold.
- "Hot means the range is active. Do not go forward of the firing line.
- 9. No handling of firearms when range is Cold
- 10. All firearms must be racked or cased & off the firing line with bolts open or chamber indicated and magazines removed when range is Cold.
- 11. Bench rest, BR-50, CMP and Highpower disciplines have control of the entire firing line during their matches. All lanes will be closed to non-participants at that time.
- 12. Check website for the times when the disciplines have matches scheduled.

500 METER RANGE

The 500 Meter Range consists of 18 shooting benches, the first 12 are for general use by all members and their guests. The benches are numbered 1 thru 18 from left to right. The qualification process is posted in the club house and on the bulletin board at the 500 meter range. That process is:

- 1. Shoot a 3 shot group a 100 yards to verify rifle zero.
- 2. Obtain bullet weight and velocity.
- 3. Calculate the necessary sight change to impact at 500 meters (547 yards).
- 4. Prove proper sight adjustment from calculations in step "3" by shooting another 3 shot group at 100 yards with the calculated adjustments made to your sights. The group should be 9 inches to 17 inches high depending on bullet speed and weight.
- 5. After the rifle is properly adjusted to strike high at 100 yards, the shooter to be qualified must fire 4 shots at 500 meters; all shots must strike within a 20 inch square steel plate. More than 4 shots are allowed as needed.
- 6. Upon completion of the above orientation, the member's name and \$5.00 processing fee, will be forwarded to Jon Nortemann. A special "RED 500 Meter" badge, with the members name will be made for the member to wear. The member will also have his/her membership card signed to substitute for the badge until it arrives.

THE 500 METER RANGE IS FOR QUALIFIED BRC MEMBERS ONLY! NO GUESTS! We have over 300 members qualified. Before members may use the shorter range target boards, 200 meters, 300 meters and steel targets, which co-exist on the 500 Meter Range, they MUST BE QUALIFIED AT 500 METERS. Guests are not allowed to use the shorter ranges on the 500 Meter Range at any time or the 500 meter target boards and steel

targets. NOTE: ONLY QUALIFIED BRC MEMBERS ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE 500 METER RANGE, BENCH POSITIONS 13 THRU 18 REGARDLESS OF THE RANGES AT WHICH BACKSTOPS AND TARGET BOARDS ARE INSTALLED.
