From the Membership Director,

The Beloit Rifle Club has created a new category of membership that will be called the **"Century Group"**. This "Group" will consist of members that have achieved an age and years of membership number that totals **"100"**. This group of members will be afforded the option to "CHOSE" whether to work their "8" work hours or to pass on the work requirement for any year, where the have reached **"Century Group"** status. Our intention is not to create any feelings, real or imagined, of age discrimination; hence the term "Chose".

The formula for calculating this "eligibility number" is rather simple. The number is based on your age, during the current membership year, plus the number of years of "Consecutive" BRC membership. We add the numbers together and if the total "100", you qualify. FYI: The year you joined the club is on your membership card.

Some examples might help:

1. Your age in 2022 - 60, "Consecutive" membership years 25 = "85"(not eligible)

2. Your age in 2022 - 75, "Consecutive" membership years 25 = "100"(eligible)

Hope this explanation is helpful. Please contact us if you feel that you are qualify for this "Century Group". Eligibility will not be determined by the membership personal, it is up to you to contact us.

DUES FOR 2023

One other point that needs to be considered is the fact that the new work hour schedule, for reducing your dues, is now based on \$25.00 per hour. Each hour you work will be worth \$25.00 off your dues. This chart is for all members of the Beloit Rifle Club. This change applies to ALL CURRENT members, even the members who joined in 2022. The "16" work hour requirement no longer exists, it was voted down by Board action, April 6, 2022

I hope you all have had a good winter. I'm ready for it to be over that is for sure. I'm definitely more of a warm weather girl and I'm really hoping I get out and shoot more in this upcoming spring. It seems like I'm always saying that! Things have stayed busy down at the club this winter with winter shooting leagues, membership renewal and of course



the new indoor range development. Winter shooting leagues will be coming to an end in March and April. We hope you have had the opportunity to participate in them and keep up your skills. We have some of our outdoor disciplines starting this month-like steel challenge but most start in May. I hope you get out and join in with as many of these as you can or even just one. BRC is an amazing community to be a part of. New friendships and the things you can learn if you are willing or needing- amazing. Membership renewal has us seeing over 1100 members this year. We had dropped below last year, so I'm glad to see us back up again. One of the best things you can do as members is help encourage and sponsor new members. Continued growth always makes for a strong future and we need to keep that up. Remember, someone had to sponsor you to get in so help out when and where you can. Show perspectives what we have and go over the rules with them. Be an encouraging member and help others join what we have responsibly and safely.

The Board has recently brought a few new changes to renewal in 2023 for members. 1) New 1st year members no longer have to work the 16 hours, it is now 8 hours like all members. Keep in mind work hours are worth \$25.00 an hour up to 8 hours in 2023. 2) the Centennial club has been created. If your years of membership and age equal 100 or more, you are no longer required to work your work hours for the base dues. It will be up to the member to get that worked out with membership but it is a good way to honor our older members and help them keep their memberships when they may not be physically able to do the work any more.

So an update on the indoor range build. We are still waiting on our MEP drawings- mechanical, electrical and plumbing drawings. Once we get those back we can take it out to general contractors to start quoting and we will be sending the prints to the Village of Beloit and State of Wisconsin for our building permits. We've been told the state permit can take up to 6 months so we are guessing between all thats left to do building really won't start until Spring of 2023. We have also learned through the village that we will be mandated to connect to the sewer that is on Philhower Road. We thought it was distance from current sewer line to connection point on the property but with us being commercial it is actually if your property is within 1000ft of a line. This is mandated from the Federal level, down to the State and local community through the Clean Water Act overseen by the DNR. This process has slowed down the MEP drawings but hopefully they will be finished up soon.

The Fundraiser Committee is working hard. We have proposed and had approved by the Board a Naming & Recognition Opportunities drive. We will be releasing it to membership very soon. So watch for that.

CT's Firearms & Archery in Monroe is member owned and in support of the project they have donated four firearms and two \$300. gift certificates to us. (on a side note, seriously go check them out and thank them for helping BRC out!) With that donation we are breaking them into two raffles and winner takes all. We are also working on a joint venture with the VFW in Janesville. It will be a smoked pig luncheon with raffles, silent auctions and a poker tournament. So save July 23rd and come join us for the afternoon!

3. Contact the Chief Range Officer or a member of the executive board in a timely manner.

4. Know the rules yourself and follow them.

Some serious violations can result in the loss of club membership but we would prefer members follow the common sense safety rules.

BRC Historian (Life Membership)

In the article "Back the Badge", it was stated that the yellow or gold badges are for Life Members. Those badges are issued to members who have met certain obligations and who have gone above and beyond what is expected from a regular member.



So let's look at the Silhouette Range and Life Member, James Browning. James Browning joined the Beloit Rifle Club in 1975. At that time wasn't there а Silhouette Range. All the land west of the Trap Range that is owned by the Beloit Rifle Club was rented to a farmer who had corn planted on it.

The year was 1980-1981. Some of the Beloit Rifle Club members who were shooting Center Fire Silhouette at Lodi, Wisconsin range at the time decided that they needed to build a Silhouette Range for the .22 cal. rimfire rifle that was gaining in popularity at the time.

So a group of shooters and members that shot Silhouette did just that. Together with Jim, they built the Silhouette Range that stands and is used today.

An outdoor Silhouette match is 40 shots at metal targets within a certain time limit. A hit is when the target falls off its metal stand. You get 1 shot at each of the 10 chickens at 40 meters, 1 shot at each of the 10 pigs at 60 meters, 1 shot at each of the 10 turkeys at 77 meters, and 1 shot each of the 10 rams at 100 meters, for a total of 40 shots per match.

For those members who are interested in shooting .22 Silhouette, please contact: Steve Schmalz (608) 362-7172 for details. He is the head of the Silhouette Range.

Jim Browning is a Life Member of the Beloit Rifle Club. He was the first range officer or the head of the Silhouette Range. He was the 1st BRC member to tie the record number of hits on turkey at the class "A" match at te Lodi, WI range. - 9-straight. Jim was the first shooter to shoot 5 turkeys in a row during a match at the BRC. He also was the first shooter to knock over ten pigs during a match at BRC. When you shoot and hit 5 straight <u>or</u> 10 straight targets, you receive a lapel pin in the shape of the Silhouette you earned it for with the number 5 or 10 stamped on it.

Jim has earned many awards for his shooting over the years. Jim also shot Trap at the BRC and also at the Izaak Walton Range in Beloit. In the early years when Silhouette was going strong, there were a lot of shooters attending the matches. It wasn't unusual to see 40 to 50 shooters attend. I shot Silhouette back then, Jim shot in the heavy class guns and I in the sporter class. That's back when .22 cal. ammo was more available and cheaper. Some of the early Silhouette range officers were Ed Vepraskas, Bill Wintlend, Bill Larson, and Dennis Loertscher.

Jim quit shooting competition shooting in 2005. As you can see by the 2005 club officer notice taken from the "Home on the Range" newsletter, Jim Browning became Beloit Rifle Club's Vice President. Prior to that. he also was Assistant Range Officer under the-Chief Range Officer, "Hud" Hudzinski. I also have an old club membership card that states that Dennis Loertscher was

Active Shooter Awareness

On January 26th and February 19th 2022, the Beloit Rifle Club sponsored an Active Shooter Awareness seminar hosted by the Janesville VFW post #1621. The seminar was presented by Greg Jones, a retired FBI agent as well as club member.

Presented was the FBI statistics on active shootings in the United States. How the everyday Concealed Carry person can help deter one and what they need to be aware of in regards to law enforcement response. This doesn't mean you just respond to an active shooter event. Things you need to be aware of: how much training have you had? are you capable of responding, physically, psychologically, emotionally? are you close enough to respond? How do you not get mistaken for the shooter? These are just a few things to consider.

The seminar was very informative and highly recommended to attend one if and when another presents itself. Gaining this knowledge of Active Shooter Awareness may save your life and others.

Emergency Plan

The BRC board has developed and implemented an emergency plan for the club. We have prepared an action plan with the Beloit Township Fire Department and most importantly informing the membership in what to do in an emergency. Each range has the below sign displayed. Please familiarize yourself with it and think of how you will handle an emergency situation if it arises. The sign is as simple as we can make it but with as much information as possible.

Call 911 / Administer Aide

- If you have to call 911, start now thinking about how you are going to word it... train your brain to say, "I have a medical emergency at the Beloit Rifle Club." NOT "Some guy just shot the guy next to him". Your wording could determine if we have the S.W.A.T. team descend on the club which would hold up the paramedics from helping you or your friend and avoid an intense sweep of the club.
- Administer Aide to the best of your ability. There are emergency kits in the Clubhouse, Main Range shack, Black Powder Lodge, back 100yrd/500m range shack and by Cowboy. We will be improving these and keeping them updated. Please be respectful and do not take what is not needed.

Go to gate, open & direct emergency vehicle

• If you are able or can send someone to unlock the gate and direct emergency personnel. If not, they will go to a key box on the main gate to get onto the property. Be sure to tell the 911 call center what gate and range you are at. (Last line on all signs)

Cease fire and make firearms safe on all ranges at the club if possible

• The fire department asked us to do this due to the current atmosphere. The ambulance may not enter the club if there is continued gun fire and they do not know the situation, or they may just grab and run.

Emergency Plan Continued...

- If there is someone else available, have them go to other ranges and call a cease fire and make all firearms safe. They may resume once emergency personnel has left.
- If it sounds like emergency personnel is entering or near club property, cease fire and make all firearms safe until you know what is happening.
- Help spread the word and make the emergency personnel feel safe on our property.

Call BRC President or next in line to report.

• Call the club President, VP, Secretary or Treasurer until you reach one of them to report that there has been a medical emergency so they can get to the club and help deal with anything that they would need to. Their phone numbers are on your card that should be with you at all times on the property.

DO NOT MAKE ANY STATEMENTS TO ANY MEDIA OR SOCIAL NETWORKS

- If the media happens to come out, do not make any comments to them. The Board will appoint someone to speak with the media and will take care of it. We have to protect our club and the media may take something out of context that can hurt us as a whole because of an untrained remark, it could be detrimental to the club.
- Do not post anything on a social network about what has happened. Social network images or statements can also be detrimental, so please do not take a picture and say, "Look at what just happened at Beloit Rifle Club".

• The media casts a negative light on stories dealing with firearms, it is not a time to get involved in gossiping and spreading what you know. It is best to let the professionals handle these situations.

Take notes, fill out incident report and keep witnesses at the scene

- There will be file holders with each sign that will hold paper and pens in order to do this. This will be for any emergency personnel and our insurance company.
- In the file holder will also be incident reports. These are required by our insurance company so please fill out to the best of your ability. Give it to the board member that is there or place in guest fee/admission box inside club house door.
- Keep the witnesses at the scene until emergency personnel have taken any needed statements from them. Witnesses should also take notes as to what happened.

The last line on the sign will be our address and where you are at on the range. We have coordinated a map with the fire department to make this as seamless as possible in an emergency. Please think about what you will do in an emergency, spread the word, talk about it, and ask questions if you have them. This is extremely important on so many levels.

STANDARD OPERATING RULES FOR 500 METER RANGE

1. Red Badge Certified Members Only. Red Badge must be worn.

2. All Shooters must sign in prior to shooting. (A sign-in sheet will be in the shed next to the guest sign-in sheet. Sign in with date, name, time in/out.)

3. All shooting to be done from the bench top only. (No prone or standing are allowed.)

4. No hand guns allowed. Only rifles or bolt-action pistols.

5. Every time prior to using 200/300/500m range, rifle and ammunition must be sighted in at 100 yards. a 5 shot 3 inch group must be held to move to 200/300/500m distances.

6. Minimum muzzle velocity must exceed 2300 ft per second. If in doubt do not shoot until you can get chronographed.

7. Only BRC provided steel targets allowed.

8. When 'cease fire' is called, properly display Hot/Cold sign with warning light.

-"Cold" means it is safe to go down range. Warning lights to be on when range is cold.

- "Hot means the range is active. Do not go forward of the firing line.

9. No handling of firearms when range is Cold.

10. All firearms must be racked or cased & off the firing line with bolts open or

chamber indicated and magazines removed when range is Cold.

11. Bench rest, BR-50, CMP and Highpower disciplines have control of the entire firing line during their matches. All lanes will be closed to non-participants at that time.

12. Check website for the times when the disciplines have matches scheduled.

500 METER RANGE

The 500 Meter Range consists of 18 shooting benches, the first 12 are for general use by all members and their guests. The benches are numbered 1 thru 18 from left to right. BENCHES 13 THRU 18 ARE POSI-TIONED FOR USE OUT TO 500 METERS AND ARE ONLY TO BE USED BY THOSE BRC MEMBERS WHO HAVE GONE THROUGH THE QUALIFICATION PROCESS FOR THAT RANGE. <u>NO GUEST IS</u> <u>ALLOWED TO USE THIS PORTION</u> <u>OF THE RANGE.</u>

The qualification process is posted in the club house and on the bulletin board at the 500 meter range. That process is:

1. Shoot a 3 shot group a 100 yards to verify rifle zero.

2. Obtain bullet weight and velocity.

3. Calculate the necessary sight change to impact at 500 meters (547 yards).

4. Prove proper sight adjustment from calculations in step "3" by shooting another 3 shot group at 100 yards with the calculated adjustments made to your sights. The group should be 9 inches to 17 inches high depending on bullet speed and weight.

5. After the rifle is properly adjusted to strike high at 100 yards, the shooter to be qualified must fire 4 shots at 500 meters; all shots must strike within a 20 inch square steel plate. More than 4 shots are allowed as needed.

6. Upon completion of the above orientation, the member's name and \$5.00 processing fee, will be forwarded to Jon Nortemann. A special "RED 500 Meter" badge, with the members name will be made for the member to wear. The member will also have his/her membership card signed to substitute for the badge until it arrives. THE 500 METER RANGE IS FOR QUALIFIED BRC MEMBERS ONLY! NO GUESTS! We have over 300 members qualified. Before members may use the shorter range target boards, 200 meters, 300 meters and steel targets, which co-exist on the 500 Meter Range, they MUST BE QUALIFIED AT 500 METERS. Guests are not allowed to use the shorter ranges on the 500 Meter Range at any time or the 500 meter target boards and steel

targets. NOTE: ONLY QUALIFIED BRC MEMBERS ARE ALLOWED TO USE THE 500 METER RANGE, BENCH POSITIONS 13 THRU 18 REGARDLESS OF THE RANGES AT WHICH BACKSTOPS AND TAR-GET BOARDS ARE INSTALLED.

I will be qualifying members to use the 500 meter range on any Wednesday morning that the 'Wednesday Morning Group' shoots, between 9:00 AM and noon. I will also qualify members on the Saturdays that Center Fire Bench Rest Matches are scheduled. You may call the other 9 members to set up other times if needed.

If you are shooting a caliber that is damaging our steel targets and/or range facilities, PLEASE STOP. This club belongs to each BRC member and needs to be treated with respect. Normal wear

to be treated with respect. Normal wear and tear is expected but should not be accelerated. Thank-you.

Remember: These Are Rules

1. No unintended discharge of a firearm.

2. No rounds to leave the range.

3. Wear your safety glasses and hearing protection

4. ALL members, whether new this year or a 40 year plus veteran have a duty to see that our rules and procedures are followed. Politely remind each other if infractions are observed. We have a 'jewel' of a club. Please keep it that way. THANK YOU!

5. No 50 BMG's to be used on Club grounds at any time!

6. Always wear your Membership Badge. Email or call if you have questions.
