Relays: 10 competitors per relay, additional relays as needed. The Match starts on time at Noon. Be at the range by 1145AM.

Course of Fire: All Matches 55 Rounds on a SR-1 at 100 yards, 5 rounds sighter, 20 rounds Slow Fire Prone 25 minutes, 10 rounds Rapid Fire Prone 75 seconds, 10 rounds Rapid Fire Sitting 80 seconds, 10 rounds Slow Fire Standing 10 minutes.

Clinic Fee: includes certificate and match fee, 21 years and over \$25.00, Juniors: \$5.00

Match Fee: Member:\$10.00, Non-Members \$15.00, Youth \$5.00. Rifle & Ammunition Package \$60.00 plus entry fee.

Who May Enter: Any American Citizen who has not had their firearm rights removed. Affidavits may be printed from <https://thecmp.org/wp-content/uploads/Affidavit.pdf>. Must be notarized to obtain CMP Awards. A Notary will be available at most matches.

Equipment: Any as-issued service rifle listed in the CMP Games Rules, Most standard AR-15's are acceptable.

Equipment is limited but available, shooting jackets, shooting gloves, scope stands and rifle-ammo packages.

What is The CMP ?

The federal law enacted in 1996 (Title 36 U.S. Code, 40701-40733) that created the Corporation for the Promotion of Rifle Practice and Firearms Safety, Inc. (CPRPFS, the formal legal name of The CMP-Civilian Marksmanship Program) mandates these key "functions for the corporation:

1. To instruct citizens of The United States in marksmanship;
2. To promote practice and safety in the use of firearms;
3. To conduct competitions in the use of firearms and to award trophies, prizes, badges, and other insignia to competitors.

CMP Clinics are lead by Certified CMP Instructors. The instructor combines combat rifle skills with precision rifle skills to ensure students learn to move safely, proficiently and always shoot accurately. This systematic approach to rifle practice ensures quick acquisition of targets and accurately placed shots every time the trigger is released.

CMP Matches provide a structured environment to learn and maintain, The Fundamentals of Marksmanship. CMP Instructors provide guidance to new shooter throughout the match. Bring your shooting skills to the next level. Build confidence with your rifle. Take the time to learn and implement the art of marksmanship (**Safety, Accuracy, Proficiency**). The CMP sanctions **As-Issued military** matches to "**Honor those that served.**" Almost any **.30 caliber** military carbine/rifle or **5.56 caliber** military style carbine/rifle may be used at the match. The most popular are the AR15, M1A, and M1 Garand, as well as the .303 British, Mosin-Nagant, 1903 Springfield, even the M1 Carbine, SKS and AK47 is welcome. Marksmen in the Modern Military and Unlimited class may use a rifle scope (4.5x32 max.).

U.S. Military, Active, Veterans, Reserve, and Guard. Your four top match scores throughout the season will be added together. The U.S. Military marksman with the highest points out of 2000 will receive a 1oz .999 pure **Silver Coin** inscribed, "Land of the Free because of the Brave."
